This program is new. Therefore, the number of students who graduate, the number of students who are placed, or the starting salary you can earn after finishing the educational program are unknown at this time. Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled

 students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes ontime graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called
 to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in
 the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
 applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution
 has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six
 months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student
 completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



Student's Right to Cancel

A student has the right to cancel his or her agreement for a course of instruction, without any penalty or obligation if notice of cancellation is made through attendance of the first class session or seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Cancellation may occur for the following reasons:

- Rejection of Applicant: If an applicant is rejected for enrollment, or if a prospective international student has his/her visa application rejected, a full refund of all monies paid will be made to the applicant.
- Program Cancellation: If an institution cancels a program subsequent to a student's enrollment, a full refund all monies paid will be made to the applicant
- Cancellation Prior to the Start of Class or No Show: If an applicant accepted for admission cancels prior to the start of scheduled classes or never attends class (no-show), a full refund of all monies paid will be made to the applicant.
- Cancellation after the Start of Class: If an applicant cancels after class begins, but before the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later, a full refund of all monies paid will be made to the applicant.

Cancellation shall occur when the student gives verbal or written notice of cancellation at the address of the institute shown on top of the front page of the enrollment agreement. Students can do this in person, by phone, mail, hand delivery, or email. We do not have a format requirement for the verbal or written notice of cancellation but it must be expressed that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the enrollment agreement.

If any books and supplies were distributed to the student prior to cancellation, the student is responsible for the charges associated with those distributions. The student has the option to return any books and supplies, and receive full credit to their account, within 30 days following the date of cancellation.

NHI will refund 100% of any monies paid, less any charges for books and supplies retained by the student within 45 days of cancellation.

If the student has received federal financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from student financial aid program funds.
